1	HEARING OFFICER: Good afternoon.
2	My name is Joseph Meagher, and I'm General
3	Counsel to the Broome County Industrial
4	Development Agency. The Agency today is
5	conducting a hearing pursuant to General
6	Municipal Law 859-A to seek public comment
7	on the Application for Financial Assistance
8	which has been submitted to the Agency by
9	Vestal Park, LLC, in connection with a
10	proposed multi-unit residential complex to
11	be located at 4710 Vestal Parkway in the
12	Town of Vestal. The acceptance of the
13	filing by the Agency does not infer any
14	position on the approval or disapproval of
15	the financial assistance requested. No
16	position will be taken by the Agency until
17	the public hearing is concluded.
18	Copy of the Application along with
19	the Cost Benefit Analysis prepared by the
20	Agency is available for your review. Notice
21	of this hearing was published in the Press &
22	Sun Bulletin on March 27th, 2014.
23	I request that each person wishing to
24	speak state his or her name, and if you're
25	Speaking on behalf of an entity or organ

ization, please identify that entity or organization. The hearing will remain open until all public comment is concluded.

Now, first I'm going to request that Kevin McLaughlin, the Executive Director of the Agency, explain the benefits that have been requested by Vestal Park, LLC.

Kevin.

KEVIN McLAUGHLIN: Thanks, Joe.

The project at 4710 Vestal Parkway will comprise of two student projects. The first includes the acquisition of the existing student housing property that includes 186 units and 710 student housing units. The property will be refurbished and improved to meet the current demands for student housing in the market and to complement the growth and expansion plans of Binghamton University.

There are four buildings comprising approximately 311,000 square feet which are four-story, wood frame construction with shingle roofs. Each apartment has a full service kitchen and is furnished. A small management office and community spaces are

included in one of these buildings.

The second project includes the demolition of two office buildings that will become vacant at the -- in May of this year and will be replaced in student construction and townhouses, also in position to support the planned growth of Binghamton University.

A larger building will comprise 350,000 square feet and include 225 apartments and 753 beds of new student housing, plus approximately 10 four-bedroom townhouses targeted for graduate students and upper class students. The larger buildings will include several floor plans, including four-bed, four-bath, and each unit will include a full kitchen. The structure will be four stories and is currently planned with wood frame with concrete block stairs and elevator shafts. The townhouses are planned as four-bedroom and four-and-a-half bedrooms -- bathrooms and will have full kitchens and will be fully furnished.

The total project as outlined in the Application is \$54,000,000 for the new student housing project, and to acquire the

existing, um, project will be approximately \$48,000 -- \$48,000,000 in new -- in new Mortgages. The, um, the pilot there will be approximately 15,882,000 of abatement for this project, but the actual pilot payment that has been agreed to by the Town of Vestal is \$46,285,000.

Thank you.

HEARING OFFICER: All right. Does anyone wish to speak?

MARK BRENO: I do, and I don't care to be on camera. My name is Mark Breno. I live here in Vestal. I own the American Business Express. We're a same-day expediter.

The IDA, I guess I'm confused, because I hear you're here to bring business into this area, the tune of \$8,000,000.

That's not working very well with the Town Square Mall when tax receipts are down. I pay for street lights I don't have where I live out in South Vestal, but I pay for the ones local.

IDA, you want to give somebody that's going to create five jobs, as I read that

paper article, that doesn't seem proper. We gave them \$8,000,000. You realize these student houses start at \$800 a month and go up? That's a start for a two-bedroom. Now you just add that up, it comes to roughly, I don't know, \$380,000 a month. You want to give these people again our taxpaying money, all of us here?

I watch these businesses go out.

Hidden Valley's gone. Peg Winn's (phonetic)

leaving. IDA, is not the idea that you

bring business in here, actual businesses

that create jobs? We want to give it to

people that want to put student housing up

again. They get tax breaks. Well, who's

going to pay for the sewage? Again, I'm

waiting. I'm on a septic system. I pay for

street lights I don't have. I'm waiting to

get that through.

The IDA is -- the idea is you use this money that is given to you by us, the taxpayers, to bring business in here. Student housing isn't a business. They say they're going to create five jobs, 200,000, \$40,000 jobs. For doing what? Once again

we're confused. What, we want to give away money to these people that if they sit empty nothing's collected, they don't pay taxes on them?

The Town -- and it doesn't matter what we say here, because everybody -- checks have been spent and everybody's agreed to it. We can't even -- we voted down as taxpayers for a firetruck that the Town decided, well, we need it anyways.

You know, student housing, let SUNY put it up there. We're taxpayers, we're going to pay for it anyways. I'm tired of seeing the IDA -- you haven't brought much into this town. I know, I own a business. I take no quarter, I give no quarter. don't give anything. I don't get loans. I don't get free interest loans. I get nothing. I pay my taxes. I don't live -- I don't work within a mile of this school, so every employee that I pay, I pay their taxes too.

The IDA, the idea is you bring business in here. What business have you brought? I can name businesses that have

left. We're creating -- we want to give these people \$17,000,000. Wow, that's great. For what? To put brick and mortar up. Like I said, just estimate it. Think of \$380,000 a month. Their tax break is 42,000,000, 48,000,000. For what? Five jobs.

I mean, it seems like it's a no brainer situation. Again, we're here. We're the ones that are going to get stuck with this, folks, whether you realize it or not. You got a sewage treatment plant that can't handle the load now. Who's going to be paying for that?

And again, I'm not a happy camper. I live in a two-bedroom home -- starter home that I can't sell here in Vestal. And I pay for lights that I don't have. And the Town's idea is you drive through Vestal, yeah, me and everybody else in the County, turn off the lights. I don't care. You don't collect my garbage. I take care of that myself. I have a septic system. Once again, you're going to give away my money, everybody's money here, to somebody that,

where do they live? Where do these folks come from?

I love -- BU is a great entity.

14,000 students. On average if they spend

\$100 a year in this area, do the math. But

it seems like you folks don't want to do

that.

IDA, industrial development. Industrial. What do we have industrialwise? Peg Winn, anybody taking over Peg Winn? I3 right across here. BAE. Lockheed Martin. You folks are all there for them. The businesses that pay the taxes you're not. Now you want to give away the money again to somebody who doesn't even manufacture anything. That's going to start -- start selling these things and renting them.

They have a three-year backlog on the other place. Three years. Now, if I'm a betting man, and I'm only a high school educated, I'm going to say if I have a backlog of three years and I'm making a half-amillion to 650,000 a month, I can go to bank on that, folks. So, they're working off of your money and my money and your taxpayers.

I don't know where you folks live.

It seems like IDA, industrial, that's where we should be putting our efforts in.

Not giving away the money again to somebody else who doesn't need it. They get the tax breaks. How's that working? Pilot? Anybody? It's almost as good as Cuomo's -
Cuomo's latest thing to put new business by the school and you get ten years free. Not one company has come in. There's nothing that's come into this area. We watch it leave. And again, as a taxpayer and a businessman I get hit with the bill.

And as my kids say, dad, why do you vote? I told them, because people have given their lives and sacrificed for the belief. And it is a belief because it doesn't work. I know that. Come on, you got to be smarter than that, guys. But as I said, it isn't going to matter what anyone of us say, checks have been cashed and it's done. It's a done deal. I'm just tired of paying for it.

And if it goes on record, that's great. Like I said, this is pretty much

16	But anyway, according to this, it
17	indicates that, you know, it's going to be
18	just shy of \$16,000,000 in terms of, you
19	know, savings. And I have to agree with the
20	gentleman that just spoke, I don't think
21	this project sounds like these people are
22	going to need to save money, you know, over
23	that time period given, you know, the amount
24	of income they're going to have from this
25	project. Um, I'm certainly not opposed to

any kind of economic development, but that amount of money for five jobs is an awful lot of money. And I'm not sure that that's cost effective.

And the other thing is our property taxes, you know, um, where do we get our tax abatement, you know? We just don't. goes up all the time. So, I'm thinking, if we really have development, like we have the Town Square Mall, you know, as far as Vestal goes, we've been shortchanged with all of these things, you know, companies like Walmart and Sam's -- Sam's Club get great tax breaks, you know, but the average guy, like he says. And for years my parents had a small business in Binghamton and I know the small business guy really doesn't get a break, you know. Neither does the -neither does the small homeowner, you know.

And, you know, who has stayed here -again, like he mentioned, you know, we've
had so many businesses leave the area, but,
you know, there are reasons for that but we
can't -- you know, I don't think we can
continue to give the tax breaks to, you

know, situations that create, you know, a handful of jobs at best and then are going to get, you know, a significant amount of money. Plus, you know, they're going to have, you know, quite an income throughout that whole time period.

SUNY Binghamton is a great asset to the community, but there are other issues. I think his -- his comment about, you know, the extra sewage that's going to need to be treated from that development is also a major issue and could end up costing millions of dollars. So, overall, um, you know, it's -- it's nice we're going to, you know, get something new. And I do think, you know, student housing is a good -- a good thing to do and those students will spend money in the community and that's nice, but whether the company trying to do this deserves to get millions of dollars in tax breaks, you know, I would say no. if -- it's the kind of thing, too, that something that we should vote on election day. If most of the people in Vestal want to give them that tax break, fine.

14	HEARING OFFICER: Thank you.
15	MARLINE FREY: Okay. I, as a tax-
16	payer, a former landlord of a couple two-
17	family properties, know both sides and can
18	sympathize with both sides. I, as a con-
19	sumer, if I could keep \$1 in my pocket, I
20	can spend it the way I want to. Likewise,
21	these investors are the same way. However,
22	I feel the difference is they'll be subsi-
23	dized with these tax breaks where I, as a
24	consumer, won't get subsidized.
25	And I agree with this man and with

that man, why should we subsidize the owners for only five jobs? We, as taxpayers, we provide a lot. We subsidize everybody. We provide student loans. We provide welfare. We provide all kinds of things that the State provides which comes from our money. And when I hear these people say, oh, it's a federal fund, it's a tax fund, it's a fund of fund. The money would not be there without every single taxpayer. We're subsidizing the people who don't pay taxes.

These people are investors and they're going to get money -- they're going to invest whether they -- they get this subsidy or not, this tax break. They will invest because that's their business.

That's how they make money. I know from just a little two-family rental property that the object was to get the money in.

That's going to pay the taxes, the maintenance and the care plus money in my pocket to repay my expenditure of money.

But this is -- they will build these buildings whether they -- whether we give them this tax break or not. I'm convinced

of that, because that's the kind of business they're in and that's why they're success-And they're trying to keep that dollar in their pocket, just like I am, but I'm not getting subsidized as a taxpayer. And it's every single taxpayer and we're the last men on the totem pole. And when something happens and they need more money, where do they get it from? Taxpayers. Whether I'm paying \$10 taxes at the end of the year or thousands of dollars, it doesn't matter, it's coming from your salary, everybody's salaries, coming from that. These men know that. They're very good, shrewd businessmen, and I admire them. And I want to be subsidized too if you want to subsidize their taxes.

And I wish everybody well. I think we should take the emotionalism out and face the facts. Where's the money going to come from? And if something doesn't get a little -- I can't say subsidized, but somehow a little break for the taxpayer, eventually I see revolt down the line in years to come. Because we're finally going to get fed up.

1 Look how few are here to voice for the many. 2 I just think you should think, and like the 3 other man said, put it to a vote, and if the 4 whole population thinks that's what we 5 should do as a town, then do it, but don't do it just on a few people here. 6 7 Thank you for your time. 8 **HEARING OFFICER:** Thank you. 9 Does anyone else wish to be heard? 10 MARLINE FREY: Could I have another 11 question? 12 **HEARING OFFICER:** Yes. 13 MARLINE FREY: Oh, I forgot. 14 benefit do the taxpayers get from this 15 really? You know, more than -- other than 16 more taxes from the student housing? 17 get tremendous benefit? More money in our 18 pocket? No, I don't see so. I don't. I 19 wish somebody would explain it to me that 20 I'd understand it, because I think I'm being 21 realistic and common sense. Just use common 22 sense in this decision-making, please. 23 **HEARING OFFICER:** Okay. Thank you. 24 MARK BRENO: I have one other. 25 What's the mission statement of the IDA?

1	HEARING OFFICER: It's available on
2	the IDA's website. I don't have it here
3	with me, but it's available on the website.
4	MARK BRENO: And your position is?
5	HEARING OFFICER: I'm the General
6	Counsel.
7	MARK BRENO: Who are these folks
8	(indicating)?
9	KEVIN McLAUGHLIN: I'm the Executive
10	Director.
11	MARK BRENO: Of the IDA. What's the
12	mission statement?
13	KEVIN McLAUGHLIN: The mission
14	statement is to bring investment and jobs
15	into the community, basically is what it
16	boils down to, and it's investment and jobs.
17	MARK BRENO: Now
18	MR. McLAUGHLIN: Wait, sir. This is
19	not a question-and-answer session. We've
20	got to get through the public hearing. If
21	you want to talk to me afterward
22	HEARING OFFICER: This is an oppor-
23	tunity for the public to speak relative to
24	this project so that we will take your
25	comments. We have a court reporter here.

1 She's taking everything down. That will be 2 put into a transcript and that will be 3 presented to the members of the IDA Board. 4 But the purpose isn't to -- for the IDA to 5 answer questions. The purpose is for the 6 public to make comment that we can take back 7 to the Board. 8 MARK BRENO: I think you need to 9 review your statement policy. 10 **HEARING OFFICER:** Yes? 11 KARL WOKAN: I just wanted to add a 12 comment to what the lady said. If they 13 could show us, the public, that by giving 14 these investors these millions of dollars in 15 tax breaks, that that would also translate 16 into 250 or \$500 in, you know, real estate 17 property taxes to us, to us, then maybe it 18 would make sense. But it's only going to a 19 select handful of people and the end result 20 with this is they're going to create five 21 permanent jobs and that just doesn't seem 22 like a good deal for us.

HEARING OFFICER: Just so you're aware, the IDA hasn't taken any position on this --

1 KARL WOKAN: I'm not --2 HEARING OFFICER: -- at this point. 3 KARL WOKAN: I'm not saying that 4 they have or haven't. 5 HEARING OFFICER: They eventually 6 will vote on this project, but -- and your comments will be given to them to consider 7 8 in making their determination, and either 9 I -- I'm not a voting member of the IDA, nor 10 is Mr. McLaughlin. 11 KARL WOKAN: Mm-hm. But, you know, 12 that's -- that's my opinion, you know. mean, if you could show that it was cost 13 14 effective for me, as a taxpayer, too, then 15 maybe I wouldn't feel like it's not a good 16 But just from what I've seen, it's deal. not a good deal, you know? It's a good deal 17 18 for a select handful of people, the inves-19 tors, you know. And that's -- that's our -a problem with our whole country, you know, 20 21 we have select deals that are good for a 22 select few and the rest of us can just get 23 hungrier and hungrier, and that's not fair. 24 And we need as a population -- you 25 know, he talked about voting -- we all need

1 to get more excited about voting and we all 2 need to have the opportunity to vote on some 3 of these things like this directly, having a 4 direct vote by the public to vote on pro-5 jects like this. And we could have several 6 elections during the year.
