Mr. Solak: John Solak, Binghamton. You know, I have a problem with this potential five-million-dollar transfer of public funds into the Broome Local Development Corporation. Number one, because it seems to be a carte blanche. Once it comes

into your hands, you can do anything you want to do with it. This -- the problem that I have is you're not elected officials. So essentially, this gives you a big five-million-dollar slush fund to play with. This American Rescue Funding is sometimes nicknamed the COVID money. And of course, it has nothing to do with COVID -- the disbursement of funds to you -- just like the George Harvey Justice Building had nothing to do with the damage done by the tobacco business. I don't think you should engage in this. It's fine for your Executive Director to talk to the county. But I think you make it easy for county elected officials to abdicate their responsibility. They're just going to cut you a check. Now, I assume this money is going to go to the country club site. not, but I -- the country club would be in the IDA. This to me, is a perversion of the American Rescue Plan. It is putting too much discretion in the Executive Director's hands -- and I say to you, this is the wrong approach. This is not good policy, and you should reject it thoroughly. And I guess that's the only thing that intrigued me on the agenda today, so I'm signing off.

WHEREAS, the County has received funding through the American Rescue Plan Act to address the economic impacts from the COVID-19 pandemic and wishes to use a portion of this funding to promote economic development, and

WHEREAS, the County budgeted \$545,000 to support Marketing & Economic Development and \$150,000 for the Small Community Grant Program and wishes to use this funding to support various community projects in Broome County, and

WHEREAS, the Director of Planning requests authorization for agreements with LUMA Arts Initiative, Inc., Spiedie Fest & Balloon Rally Expo, Inc., The Agency, (Broome County Industrial Development Agency) and Various Small Community Vendors for funding to support economic development and community projects in Broome County for 2021, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby authorizes an agreement with LUMA Arts Initiative, Inc., 217 Washington Street #204, Binghamton, New York 13901 for funding in the amount of \$40,000 from the Marketing and Economic Development allocation of the occupancy tax budget line 90000099.6005026 (Marketing & Economic Development) for the period July 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby authorizes an agreement with the Spiedie Fest & Balloon Rally Expo, Inc., PO Box 275, Westview Station, Binghamton, New York 13905, for funding in the amount of \$50,000 from the Marketing and Economic Development allocation of the occupancy tax budget line 90000099.6005026 (Marketing & Economic Development) for the period January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby authorizes an agreement with the Agency, (Broome County Industrial Development Agency), 5 South College Drive, Suite 201, Binghamton, New York 13905 for funding in the amount of \$5,000,000 from the American Rescue Plan Act to administer and operate a program to support economic development projects within Broome County, and be it
