The meeting was called to order at 1:23 p.m.

ITEM #1. APPROVE THE MINUTES FOR THE MARCH 15, 2023, BOARD MEETING: Chairman Bernardo requested a motion to approve the March 15, 2023, minutes.

MOTION: Mr. Crocker motioned to approve, seconded by Mr.Gates; the MOTION CARRIED.

**ITEM #2. PUBLIC COMMENT:** Chairman Bernardo asked if there were any public comments. No public comments were made.

BUSINESS RECOVERY FUND, NEW YORK STATE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG), TO OSSAM MOHAMED D/B/A THE GREEK HOUSE RESTAURANT LOCATED AT 623 MAIN STREET, JOHNSON CITY IN THE TOWN OF UNION, COUNTY OF BROOME AND STATE OF NEW YORK, AS SET FORTH IN EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED HERETO. Mr. O'Bryan provided a brief overview of the CDBG Grant program and the project looking for funding. Board Members inquired about the length of the program and the status of funding expressing concerns regarding unused COVID funding being revoked by the federal government. Mr. O'Bryan explained that was not a concern as the program must be finished by August 2023, that there is approximately \$150,000 left in funds, and that The Agency has at least four additional

# CDBG Applicant Financial Analysis and Employee Retention Eligibility

**Applicant:** McRem LLC dba The Remedy

<u>Purpose</u>: The purpose of this financial analysis is to demonstrate the eligibility of McRem LLC for receipt of COVID Business Recovery Fund grant monies <u>as well as</u> demonstrate their job retention eligibility, as required by the Grant Guidelines.

<u>Grant Application Summary:</u> McRem LLC is seeking a grant of \$50,000 from the Broome County COVID Business Recovery Fund. The majority of this grant will serve as reimbursement for payroll expenses (88%), the remaining 12% will serve as reimbursement for rent and utilities and this reimbursement will enable the retention of one (1) employee.

**Revenue Loss and Analysis:** As per their tax returns, McRem LLC suffered greater than 1% loss from 2021 to 2022 in business revenue. This 1% loss is a requirement stipulated by the CDBG guidelines. Therefore, these losses are attributable to COVID-19 and the accompanying policy response.

**Applicant:** Gokulesh Hospitality NY LLC

<u>Purpose</u>: The purpose of this financial analysis is to demonstrate the eligibility of Gokulesh Hospitality NY LLC for receipt of COVID Business Recovery Fund grant monies <u>as well as</u> demonstrate their job retention eligibility, as required by the Grant Guidelines.

<u>Grant Application Summary:</u> Gokulesh Hospitality NY LLC is seeking a grant of \$50,000 from the Broome County COVID Business Recovery Fund. The full amount of the grant will be used to reimburse payroll expenses the business has assumed and this reimbursement will enable the retention of one (1) employee.

Revenue Loss and Analysis: As per their tax returns, Gokulesh Hospitality NY LLC suffered greater than 1% loss from 2019 to 2020 in business revenue. This 1% loss is a requirement stipulated by the CDBG guidelines. Therefore, these losses are attributable to COVID-19 and the accompanying policy response.

Total Number of Employees: 24 employees split between FT/PT Percentage of LMI Employees: more than 51%

### Jobs Retained: 1 Retained Jobs Held by LMI Persons: 1

Retention Eligibility: Gokulesh Hospitality NY LLC currently employees 24 full time and part time employees to do a mix of activities at the hotel. Due to losses suffered during the COVID-19 pandemic, people stopped traveling and Binghamton University did not have events. Both had a significant impact on the occupancy of the hotel and created revenue loss. However, business has started to pick back up again and it was important to keep employees on the roster so the hotel could accommodate the increase in guests. Since Gokulesh Hospitality NY LLC is retaining employees, these grant funds would be used to ensure that these employees are retained. Therefore, these activities qualify as retention, rather than new hires.

<u>Impact of Grant Funds:</u> Receipt of grant funds would aid Gokulesh Hospitality NY LLC in stabilizing their financial situation. The reimbursement of these working capital expenses will assist in offsetting and/or recouping losses incurred during the COVID-19 pandemic.
